Guild 30th Anniversary Celebrations



This year we are celebrating 30 years of the Dyslexia Guild! Jan Beechey, Guild librarian, has been taking a look back at the guild's history in the context of dyslexia support in the nineties when it was founded, as well as compiling some notable stats about our professional membership body.

Did you know, for example, that:

- The Dyslexia Guild's library, *The National Dyslexia Resource Centre*, was one of the first libraries dedicated to literacy difficulties to open in the UK?
- Over the past five years, 2,403 books have been borrowed (enough to stretch the length of almost five premier-league football pitches) and 97,063 e-journals have been accessed (roughly one every 15 minutes!)
- The guild has one of the fastest turnaround times for APCs often within two to six weeks

Prisoner education to become primary focus

The chief inspector of prisons in England and Wales, Mr Taylor, has said education, training and rehabilitation need to become the primary focus of jails to reduce reoffending. The government says its new Prisoner Education Service will improve outcomes for those being released from custody.

But Mr Taylor suggested that jails were failing to reduce the risk of prisoners reoffending, and that many inmates were failing to learn to read.

Others, he said, were taking part in courses which would not help them get jobs in future. Read more here.

Maths down, English up

The pass rate for GCSE mathematics resits in England has fallen, after more students had to take their exams again.

November's exam results show 22.9% of maths entries were marked at a grade 4, a standard pass, or above, down from 24.9% in 2022 and 26.9% in 2019.

22.9% of maths entries were marked at a grade 4

However, the pass rate for GCSE English resits rose to 40.3% - up from 38% and 32.3% respectively.

Under-18s in England must retake GCSE English and maths if they did not get at least a grade 4. Find out more here.

UK standardised test is newly approved by SASC

The Reynolds Intellectual Assessment Scales, Second Edition (RIAS-2) is now approved by SASC!

The RIAS2 can be used to diagnose specific disorders, such as intellectual disabilities or learning disabilities, and can be used as a way to determine educational placement. This test can be used as a stand-alone intellectual assessment or as part of a larger battery of assessments, making a useful product to have.

Debates in Parliament

On Thursday 11 January, Sir David Davis MP led a Backbench Business debate in Parliament on SEND provision and funding. Along with other MPs, he spoke about the many people who have signed petitions on the issue. He also quoted those who had shared their experiences to help inform previous debates on SEND provision and funding.

What are Backbench Business debates?

Backbench Business debates give backbenchers (MPs who aren't ministers or shadow ministers) an opportunity to secure a debate on a topic of their choice, either in the main House of Commons Chamber or Westminster Hall, the second chamber of the House of Commons.



MPs can make a request for a debate to the Backbench Business Committee, who hears requests and decides which debates to schedule.

Backbench debates can either be general debates (which do not end in a vote) or be on a substantive motion (which calls for an action and can end in a vote). This debate was a debate on a substantive motion.
