


Assessment of Memory and Learning – online course 18 March 2020

This Level 7 Specialist Assessor course ([SASC approved](#)) has been designed to enable you to measure several areas of memory and learning potential (for example, aptitude with visual and configural information, aptitude holding and manipulating sound information, associative learning, etc.) using the popular learning and memory assessment battery TOMAL2. APC Amnesty Grandparenting route

This route to Assessment Practising Certificate (APC) closes on 31st March 2020 for those qualified and practising specialist teacher assessors with a full level 7 qualification in assessment (e.g. the Professional Certificate in Assessment Practice (Middlesex) or the Postgraduate Diploma in Dyslexia and Literacy (York), or their equivalent qualifications who have not previously applied for, or held, an Assessment Practising Certificate to obtain it by completing an application form and uploading a copy of their qualification certificate. SASC new structure for Assessment Practising Certificate (APC) report reviews introduced

SASC has looked at simplifying the approach to review of assessment practice and feel that a move to a proforma used by all APC issuing bodies, while supporting one set of core criteria, will add clarity to the feedback assessors receive. It is felt that a move away from the current '3 levels' to one set of core criteria will be clearer and promote greater consistency.

These criteria with their accompanying feedback pro forma will be used by all APC issuing bodies for all reports received from 1 January 2020. Find out more [here](#).


