Associate FE/HE of The Dyslexia Guild (ADG FE/HE)

The Dyslexia Guild has a clearly defined membership grade for Study Skills Support Tutors which is <u>Associate Member Further and Higher Education (ADG FE/HE)</u>. This grade can be obtained by holding a Level 5 dyslexia/SpLD qualification such as <u>The Certificate in Supporting Adults with Dyslexia and Co-occurring Difficulties (DACRT56)</u>.

Support tutors, learning support staff in further or higher education settings working towards our Supporting Adults With Dyslexia and Co-occurring Difficulties Certificate will learn to tailor and enhance students' individual needs by developing a range of strategies and skills to improve the learner journey. It is mapped against Ofqual Level 5 descriptors as outlined in the National Qualifications Framework and will allow educators who have already completed Level 3 courses the opportunity to achieve a Level 5 Certificate online. Subject topics in this Level 5 Certificate include:

- supporting memory weaknesses
- using assistive technologies to overcome barriers in literacy
- · developing study skills to improve students access to learning
- nurturing the development of writing skills

Are you looking to apply for an Assessment Practising Certificate (APC)?

What is an APC? An APC is effectively a licence to practise. It confirms that you have the appropriate qualifications to undertake full diagnostic assessments and that your professional practice is up-to-date and has been externally verified as continuing to meet defined competence standards.



Benefits. An Assessment Practising Certificate is a quality assurance standard ensuring that qualified assessors work within the rigorous regulations, are up to date with changes and best practice within each facet of psychological assessment and report writing. It is a standard that is highly respected by clients, employers, organisations and other professionals.

How can I apply for an APC? The Dyslexia Guild is an SpLD Assessment Practising Certificate (APC) awarding body issuing Assessment Practising Certificates on behalf of the SpLD Assessment Standards Committee (SASC). Prior to applying for an APC, you must be a qualified specialist teacher assessor in dyslexia/SpLD, this can be be done by completing a SASC approved course or you must have at least seven years experience in providing full diagnostic assessments. Additionally, all applicants must meet the SASC requirements relating to Continuing Professional Development (CPD) as outlined in this document.

High Quality Professional Development is pivotal in improving children's outcomes

Research tells us that high quality teaching can narrow the disadvantage gap. It is therefore hugely encouraging to see a host of new initiatives and reforms that recognise the importance of teacher quality such as the Early Career Framework and the new National Professional Qualifications. These exemplify a growing consensus that promoting effective professional development (PD) plays a crucial role in improving classroom practice and pupil outcomes, and this guidance further reflects this, offering recommendations on how to improve professional development and design and select more impactful PD. The Education Endowment Foundation (EEF) has published a report entitled Characteristics of Effective Teacher Professional Development.
