Welcome back to the new term, we hope you had an enjoyable summer.



It was great to see attendees from across our membership grades (and non-members alike), Here is a breakdown from the survey responses:



# Education Endowment Foundation publishes two new practice reviews on writing and secondary maths

The <u>first review</u>, by a team from Sheffield Hallam Institute of Education and co-funded through a partnership with XTX Markets, looked at the practice of **teaching maths** across secondary schools. It highlights previous research that finds that due to the lack of specialist teachers, the small number available are being prioritised for 'high stakes' classes in many schools, such as high prior attainers and those with GCSE exams coming up.

This could mean that many younger pupils and classes with low prior attainers are more likely to be taught by teachers who do not specialise in maths.

The <u>second review</u>, by a team from Pearson, looked at the practice of **teaching writing** across both primary and secondary schools. A survey of teachers investigated what they thought were the biggest challenges to teaching writing. Issues like poor pupil vocabulary and inconsistent approaches to teaching writing came through strongly for both primary and secondary school teachers.

One issue highlighted by both practice reviews is access to professional development. If you're looking for CPD in these areas, why not take a look at our short courses <u>Developing Writing Skills in Learners with Dyslexia</u> or <u>Developing Numeracy Skills in Learners with Dyslexia and Dyscalculia</u>. These units and many more on other topics, run six times a year so it is easy to find one that fits around your busy schedule. Our next cohorts start on 11 September.

## **Poetry now part of Carnegie Medals**

The winning authors and illustrators of this year's Yoto Carnegie Medals were announced in front of an audience of over 6000 children.

Joseph Coelho, Waterstones Children's Laureate, took the Medal for Writing with his verse novel, *The Boy in the Maze*, and is the first black British author to win the writing medal. Judges awarded the illustration medal to Aaron Becker for his wordless picture book, *The Tree and the River*.

The applicants are judged by an expert panel of children's and youth librarians. The shortlisted titles are also judged by the children and young people taking part in 'shadowing' the judging process.

The winners of the 2024 Tir na n-Og Awards for the best books for children and young people in Wales were announced in May.



These awards also have a Shadower category, with a Reader's Choice Award for the Welsh Language in the primary age going to *Mari a Mrs Cloch* by Caryl Lewis.

## WRIT to be phased out

The Wide Range Intelligence Test (WRIT) will be withdrawn from the SASC list of suitable tests in view of its age, now that a number of other intelligence or cognitive processing tests are available to Specialist Teacher Assessors. The date for withdrawal is 1 January 2026. Assessors will have twelve months grace from this date to cease using the test and choose alternatives.

A review of Reynolds Intellectual Assessment Scales, 2nd edition (RIAS-2) is available within *Dyslexia Review* V34(2) Spring/Summer 2024, pp.25-27 and can be accessed by logging into the Guild member area.

A review of the Tests of Dyslexia is also available within the upcoming Dyslexia Review Autumn/Winter 2024 which should be with you in late October.

In Other Test News, SASC and STEC have had discussions with WPS, the publishers of TOD™, about Americanisms used in some of the tests.

#### Detailed Assessment of Speed of Handwriting 2 (DASH-2) Guidance

The SpLD Test Evaluation Committee (STEC) has now written guidance on the Detailed Assessment of Speed of Handwriting 2 (DASH-2). This has been added to the <u>website</u>.

#### Wide Range Assessment of Memory and Learning 3 (WRAML3)

The Wide Range Assessment of Memory and Learning, Third Edition (WRAML3) measures short and long-term memory functioning and the ability to learn new material in children and adults. This test is only available to be purchased by Educational Psychologists (see Pearson website, Qualification level C)

STEC (The SpLD Test Evaluation Committee) has now written guidance for this test which has been added to the <u>website</u>.

### Dyslexia job applicant awarded compensation

The case centred on an application Mr Johnston made for a job as an assistant statistician within the Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency (Nisra) in 2020.

The selection process required applicants to pass both a **numerical** and statistics test before they could proceed to the interview stage.



Mr Johnston said he was at a disadvantage during the numerical test due to the linguistic complexity of how the questions were worded.

"When you're dyslexic, tests like that are very word heavy," he said.

"The maths in the test is no problem, it's just the way it's packaged up in double negatives, triple negatives.

"You couldn't have devised a more awkward test."

Mr Johnston, a qualified maths teacher and psychology graduate, requested that he be allowed to sit an alternative numerical test in which the word content was reduced, or be offered a waiver.

When this was refused, he started discrimination proceedings funded by his union.
