Training and Professional Development

Level 7 Postgraduate Programme

Achieve a <u>Level 7 Postgraduate Certificate</u> to become a Specialist SpLD teacher/practitioner this year. This route is for graduates only and is suitable for those who wish to study at Master's level and gain university credits.

Our October 2022 cohort is already full, but registration for our next cohort in **April 2023** will open soon. If you are already an SpLD specialist teacher or assessor you may be interested in our CPD and refresher courses for qualified specialists below.

Specialist SpLD Teacher Training Level 5

The <u>Level 5 Diploma in Specialist Teaching for Literacy-Related Difficulties (DIST 02 & 03)</u> is a unique, online SpLD training qualification that is flexible and undertaken part-time. Next cohort starts **March 2023**.


Continuing Professional Development

Novel winners

The winners in this year's YOTO Carnegie Greenaway Awards have been revealed at a ceremony at the British Museum. Katya Balen won the Yoto Carnegie Medal for her novel October. October is a tale of 11-year old October, whose life changes dramatically after a childhood spent in the woods. It was also selected by the Shadowers Choice Award, voted for by thousands of young people through the shadowing scheme. The author, Katya, has spent her career working in SEND schools and is the codirector of Mainspring Arts, an organisation that runs creative workshops for neurodivergent people.

Illustration winners

Danica Nobgarodoff is the winner of the Yoto Kate Greenaway Medal for her interpretation of Jason Reynold's Long Way Down, which she has transformed into a graphic novel to convey the emotional turmoil of the main character who is planning to harm another person. The Kate Greenaway Award for Illustration Shadowers chose The Midnight Fair, illustrated by Mariachiara Di Giorgio. This wordless picture book uncovers the secret life of animals who prowl the fairground at night.

Registration to take part in Shadowing the 2023 Awards will open in **November 2022**.

Assistive technology training programme finds success in boosting teachers'

confidence supporting children using AT



In response to evidence that teachers struggled to use technology to support learners with special educational needs, the Department for Education (DfE) ran an Assistive Technology Training Pilot programme for 79 schools from January 2022 to March 2022. The training focused on upskilling school staff in identifying and implementing appropriate assistive technology for pupils with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) in mainstream schools. Dragon software training

Neil Sleight from Top Class Computers explains the rationale behind his training for Dragon speech recognition software.

"I have been an Assistive Technology trainer for nearly 29 years, and Dragon is my favourite app because it can make writing so much easier and faster for many people. Much of my work now is helping university students with dyslexia, and many of them also love Dragon for this reason!

I do find that many people make the same mistakes when using Dragon, which is a shame, because it is so good. Therefore, I do believe that some training to get you started properly is important...

To help with this I have published a 130-page **Dragon training textbook** that, as far as I know, is the only one of its kind using a dyslexia friendly font and layout. More details can be <u>found here</u>.

I have also published an **eLearning Solution** for Dragon. This currently consists of 68 video modules and 2½ hours of video, with transcriptions. There are quizzes throughout to test knowledge, and also the option to easily get in touch and ask questions if needed. The course is approved by Student Finance England and can be recommended by assessors for university students. It is also CPD certified, and any assessors are welcome to a free licence. Details of this course can be <u>found here</u>.

Both options are complete step-by-step guides for anyone wanting to use Dragon and get the most benefit from it. They cover everything from installation and setup, through dictating text, to working hands free if required."

First T-Level results are published

The new technical qualification started in 2020 with courses in education and childcare; design, surveying and planning; and digital production, taken by 1,029 students in England. There will be 16 T-level subjects available from September and more will be introduced over the next few years including accounting, agriculture and engineering.

T-levels, or Technical Levels, have been developed alongside employers and are accepted by 120 universities.
